


# Are you still Ready?



# Personal Cyber Security Tips

## PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SCAMMERS



# Be careful installing apps or software

**DO NOT** install an app or download software in order to receive a refund, win a prize, take a survey, or to get help from customer service.



# Never pay over the phone

**DO NOT** provide payment information, including gift cards (or "verification cards," as some scammers call them), for products or services over the phone. Never give a caller your personal information such as Social Security or Drivers License number, etc.



# Be wary of false urgency

**DO NOT** be pressured to act now. Scammers may try to create a sense of urgency to persuade you to do what they're asking.
